Is the College of Teaching needed? Does it have a clear purpose or mission?

- Teaching is a **standout example** of a major profession that has no independent professional body.
- There is clear consensus among supporters of the College of Teaching that its primary purpose is to **raise the status** of the profession and put it on par with law, accountancy and the numerous other professions with chartered representation.
- The absence of such a body has resulted in government defining **professional practice** over the years, disempowering the profession and affecting the standing of teaching in society.
- Teachers are becoming increasingly frustrated with accountability that does not help learners and recruitment is harder than ever. The new College offers a way to bring a **common code of practice** to teaching.
- 13,000 teachers were asked what they would value as a **membership benefit** to the College of Teaching. The top five benefits, ranked as, “**extremely valuable**” or “**valuable**” were:
 - Professional knowledge sharing – 91.2%
 - A common code of practice – 87.5%
 - Professional development – 85.9%
 - Recognition by schools – 84.1%
 - Professional standards – 82.0%.

- More than 80% of those surveyed **seek the benefits** a new College would offer, indicating a **need** for the College.
- It is vital that teachers and the profession **own this organisation** from the outset if we collectively want to take the College of Teaching forward. We have a **once in a lifetime** opportunity to make this happen.
- A **crowdfunding platform** - the modern equivalent to the subscription model used to fund other such professional bodies - launches in Autumn 2015.
